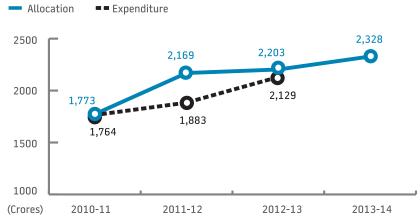

2. PER STUDENT PUBLIC VS. PRIVATE EXPENDITURE

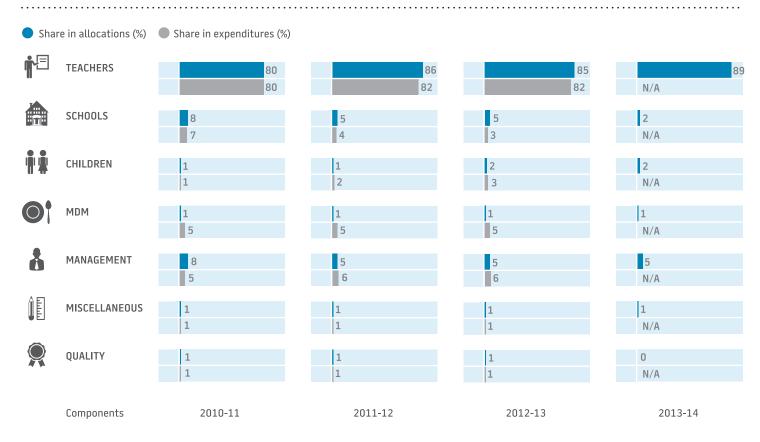

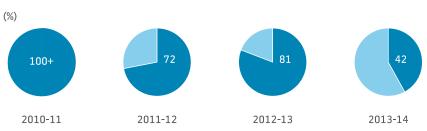

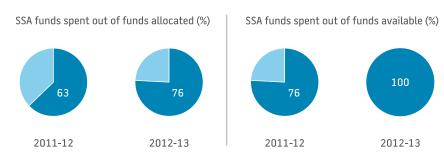

5a. SSA FUNDS APPROVED OUT OF FUNDS PROPOSED

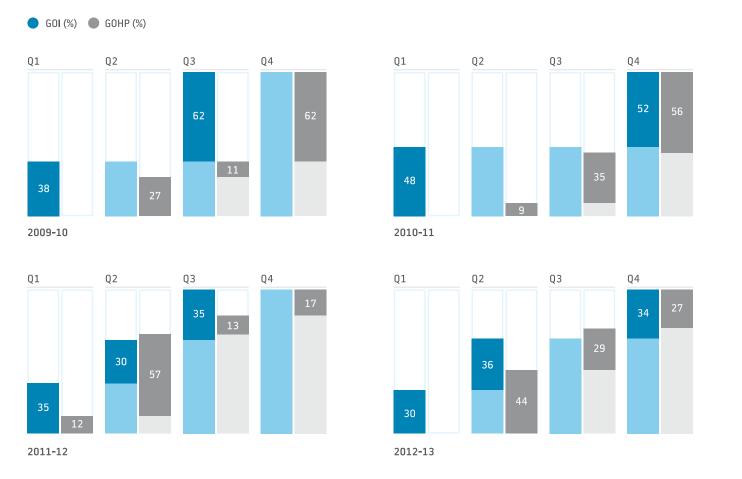


5b. SSA FUNDS SPENT OUT OF FUNDS ALLOCATED/AVAILABLE

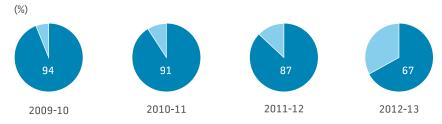

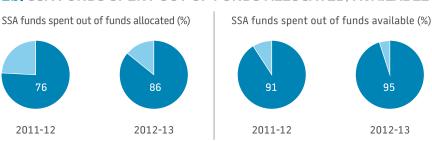

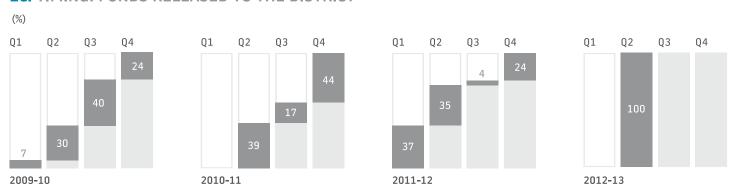


2b. SSA FUNDS SPENT OUT OF FUNDS ALLOCATED/AVAILABLE

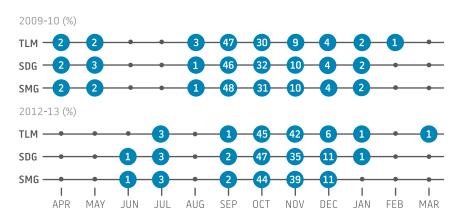

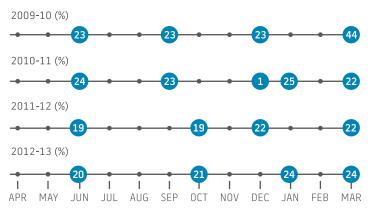

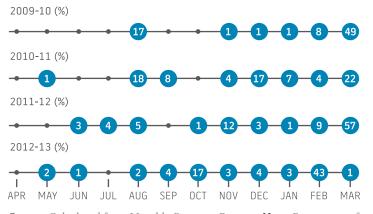

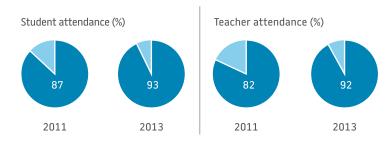

- » MEDIAN DATE OF LAST SMC MEETING WAS **05 AUGUST**, **2013**.

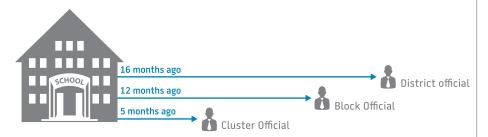

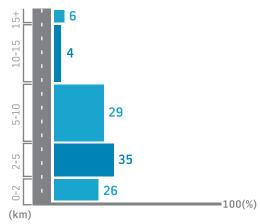
