





5a. SSA FUNDS APPROVED OUT OF FUNDS PROPOSED




5b. SSA FUNDS SPENT OUT OF FUNDS ALLOCATED/AVAILABLE






2b. SSA FUNDS SPENT OUT OF FUNDS ALLOCATED/AVAILABLE







29% schools had an open and usable boy's toilet.




Teacher's toilet

- » MEDIAN DATE OF LAST SMC MEETING WAS 03 JULY, 2013.






